## Preface

This is project plan “East African Teenagers and Social Media”, a project to be run by KingdomIT Foundation on request by Teens For Christ Africa. This plan gives answers on questions: Who, What, Where, When, Why, How, and Which resources.

## Vision and Mission

We believe that information technology (IT) is a means to enlarge the Kingdom of God. IT has become an important part of global society. IT connects people with each other and with Jesus. The Gospel can be spread across the ends of the earth by supporting Christian foundations, schools, and churches with IT tools and IT training.

KingdomIT’s mission is to worldwide improve living conditions using IT in combination with spreading the Word of God. The mission can be accomplished supplying IT-related solutions in cooperation with other Christian entities.

## Who requested this project?

We came into contact with Teens For Christ Africa (TFCA) during our previous mission trip in Africa in May 2015. TFCA evangelizes high school age teenagers in Kenya, Uganda, and Rwanda. Their target group counts for approx. 230,000 people. During our gathering we talked about cooperation opportunities. This has led to this project plan.

## What are we going to do?

We will give an awareness training about the use of social media. About 3,000 teenagers will be taught about the possibilities and issues of social media. We will also equip them how to use social media to spread the Gospel among their peers.

Social media offer many opportunities. At the other hand dangers are obvious. Think about violation of privacy, moral decay, human trafficking, undermining of norms, values, and family structure, etc. In the coming weeks we will prepare the content of workshops to be held. ### **When and where will the project take place?**

The project will be held from 16<sup>th</sup>-22<sup>nd</sup> of November 2015 at the Nyakach Girls High School in Sondu, Kenya, 60 km from Kisumu.



### **Why this project?**

We want to equip teenagers in their pursuit to obtain a personal relationship with the Lord Jesus Christ in cooperation with Teens For Christ Africa. KingdomIT will do this, using IT.

### **In what way we will do the project?**

We will conduct three workshops per day. We will focus on the opportunities and dangers of using social media, including Facebook and Twitter. We will explain how to use these tools to live out the Gospel. We will not limit ourselves to social media but also touch the “world wide web” in general, both in theoretical and practical ways.

### **Which resources will we use in the project?**

The project budget is shown in the following table. Expenses are specified by transport and lodging. We will bring a KingdomIT Box and leave the device there. Expenses are partly covered by a recent donation. For the remaining expenses we will seek sponsors.
